The Touching Bases Baseball League of Rockland needs high school and college students and adults to assist players with disabilities during low-key baseball games this fall.

The league provides a safe, enjoyable and successful experience for those ages 21 to 92, many of whom have never before been part of a team or played a game many of us take for granted.

All you need is energy, compassion and a willingness to point someone in the right direction, hand someone a ball to make a play, or take someone by the hand or push a wheelchair on the bases.

Our season begins right after Labor Day, playing outdoors in Pomona and Orangeburg in September and indoors during October in Ramapo's Torne Valley Bubble in Hillburn. Most games will be Saturday morning or early afternoon, but we'll also have an evening of games at Provident Bank Park.

Give an hour a week or spend the whole morning with us. Whatever time you can give, we can use.

This is a perfect opportunity for high school or mature middle school students to fulfill community service requirements for religious organizations or graduation. It's also a great chance for college students working toward careers in education, special education, gerontology, recreation or related areas to get some hands-on experience.
