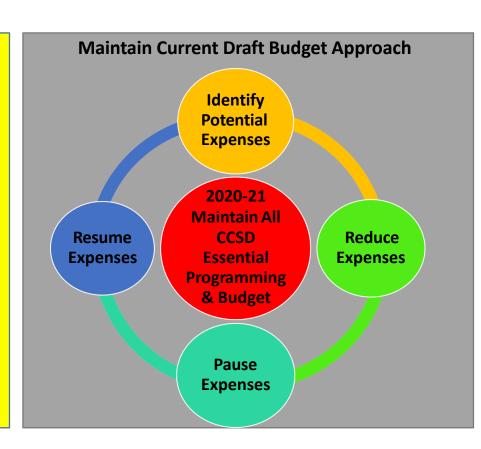

#### **Credit Overview**

Clarkstown CSD's credit position is very strong

The district's credit position also reflects a very low debt burden

Finances: The financial position of the district is healthy overall.

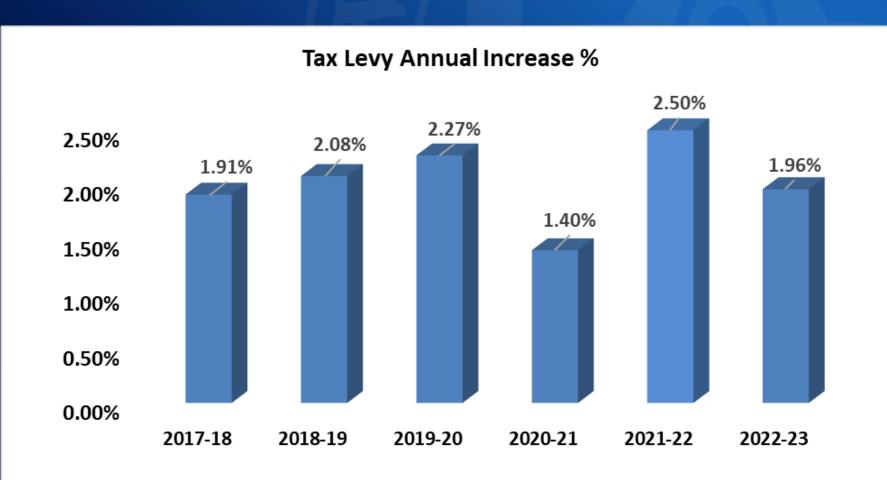
The cash balance as a percent of operating revenues (22.8%) is slightly lower than the US median, but it increased slightly from 2015 to 2019. On the other hand, the fund balance as a percent of operating revenues (9.1%) is lower than the US median.

Debt and Pensions: Clarkstown CSD has a very low debt burden that is a credit strength in comparison to its assigned rating of Aa2. The net direct debt to full value (0.6%) is markedly lower than that of other Moody's rated school Districts nationwide.

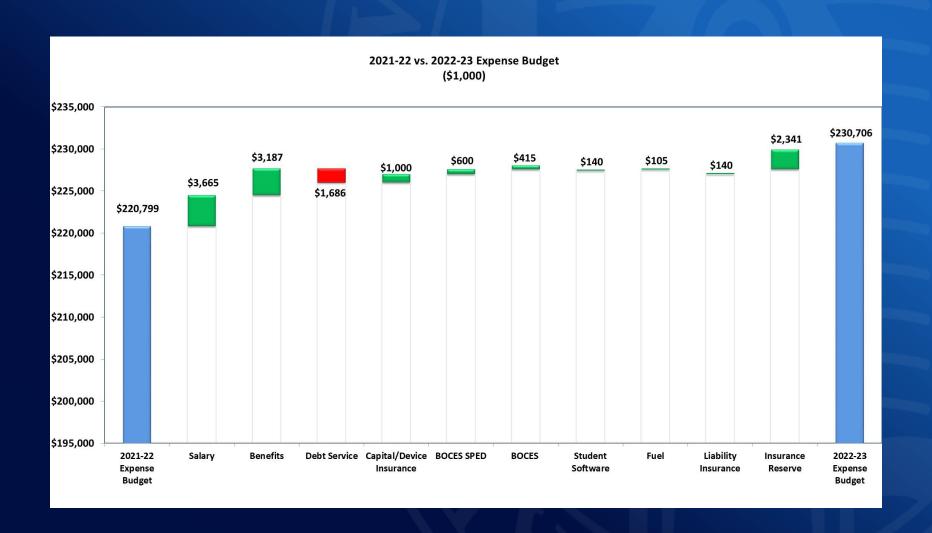
