Our childcare program is in search of a qualified candidate to join our dynamic team of caregivers. There is a potential position available as an Infant Teacher/ Infant Childcare Worker.

Childcare Workers function as teachers in our classrooms. They design instruction, work collaboratively with assistants, provide diapering/potty services, assist with feeding, communicate with parents, and help engage the children in developmentally appropriate play activities. We care for children ages 8 weeks to 5 years and our program follows the Clarkstown School calendar.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

An Associate's Degree in Early Childhood, Child Development or related field, and one (1) year of specific training and/or experience in infant or toddler care which may be demonstrated by an Infant or Toddler Child Care credential; or Child Development Associate credential, or nine (9) college credits in Early Childhood, Child Development or a related field and two (2) years of experience related to caring for children; and one (1) year of specific training and/or experience in infant or toddler care which may be demonstrated by an Infant Toddler Child Care credential. Candidates with a Bachelor's degree with early childhood credits or NYS Children's Program Administrator Credentials and teaching and supervisory experience preferred.

Good knowledge of infant and early childhood development and behavioral and educational principles and practices; good knowledge of child care techniques; ability to establish a good rapport with children and others; ability to coordinate and direct the work of others; ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing; physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position.

Hours: Childcare Workers/ Teachers work 7:30 A.M. to 4:30 P.M. daily with a morning break and one hour for lunch.
