Grades K-2

We are capable of making a difference in our community and world. You are never too young to take meaningful action. You have the power to make a difference too! A student action has a social impact on our community in and outside of school. It is **not** always collecting items. It can be initiated at home by the student and is an extension of what the student is learning in school.

Remember to **PLAN**

Problem: identify and define the problem/issue

List ideas for solving/helping the issue - set goals

Action: Create an action plan with steps towards meeting the goal

Notice: Reflecting on the success - What did I learn? What went well? What might I do differently?

Examples of Student Actions:

1. A student planned and created a multiplication battleship game to help peers learn multiplication facts.
2. A student went home and performed a science experiment that was discussed during the school day.
3. Students interviewed local politicians and created a student friendly powerpoint to share with their school with the hopes to teach other students about the election process.
